Penguins are a group of aquatic, flightless birds found almost exclusively in the southern hemisphere, especially in Antarctica. Highly adapted for life in the water, penguins have countershaded dark and white plumage, and their wings have become flippers. Most penguins feed on krill, fish, squid and other forms of sealife caught while swimming underwater. They spend about half of their life on land and half in the oceans.

Their white underside and deep black colours are perfect for camouflage. Predators looking up from the ocean floor will have difficulty distinguishing between the white belly of the penguin and the reflective water surface. The dark colour camouflages them from predators living above the water.

Penguins either waddle on their feet or slide on their bellies across the snow, a movement called "tobogganing". This movement conserves the energy of the penguin and allows them to move swiftly from one place to another. In the extreme cold of the Antarctic winter, the females fish for food in the sea and leave the males to brave the weather by themselves. They often huddle together to keep warm and rotate positions to make sure that each penguin gets a turn in the centre of the heat pack.

Although all penguin species are native to the southern hemisphere, they are not only found in cold climates. In fact, only a few species of penguin live so far south. Several species, though much lesser in number, are found in the temperate zone, and one species, the Galápagos Penguin, lives near the equator.

The largest living species is the Emperor Penguin. Adults of these species can reach heights of about 1.1m and weigh 35kg or more. The smallest penguin species is the Little Blue Penguin (also known as the Fairy Penguin), which is about 40cm tall and weighs 1kg. Larger penguins tend to inhabit the colder regions while smaller penguins are generally found in temperate or even tropical climates.

In 1959, she qualified for the 1960 Olympic Games in Rome by setting a world record in the 200-metre race.

At the games, she sprained her ankle but she ignored the pain and helped her team win a gold medal in the 400-metre relay!

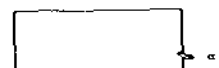

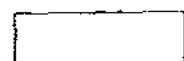
