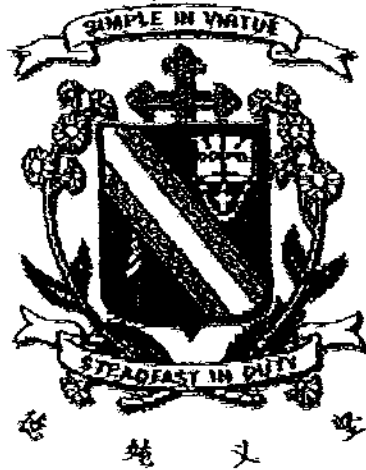

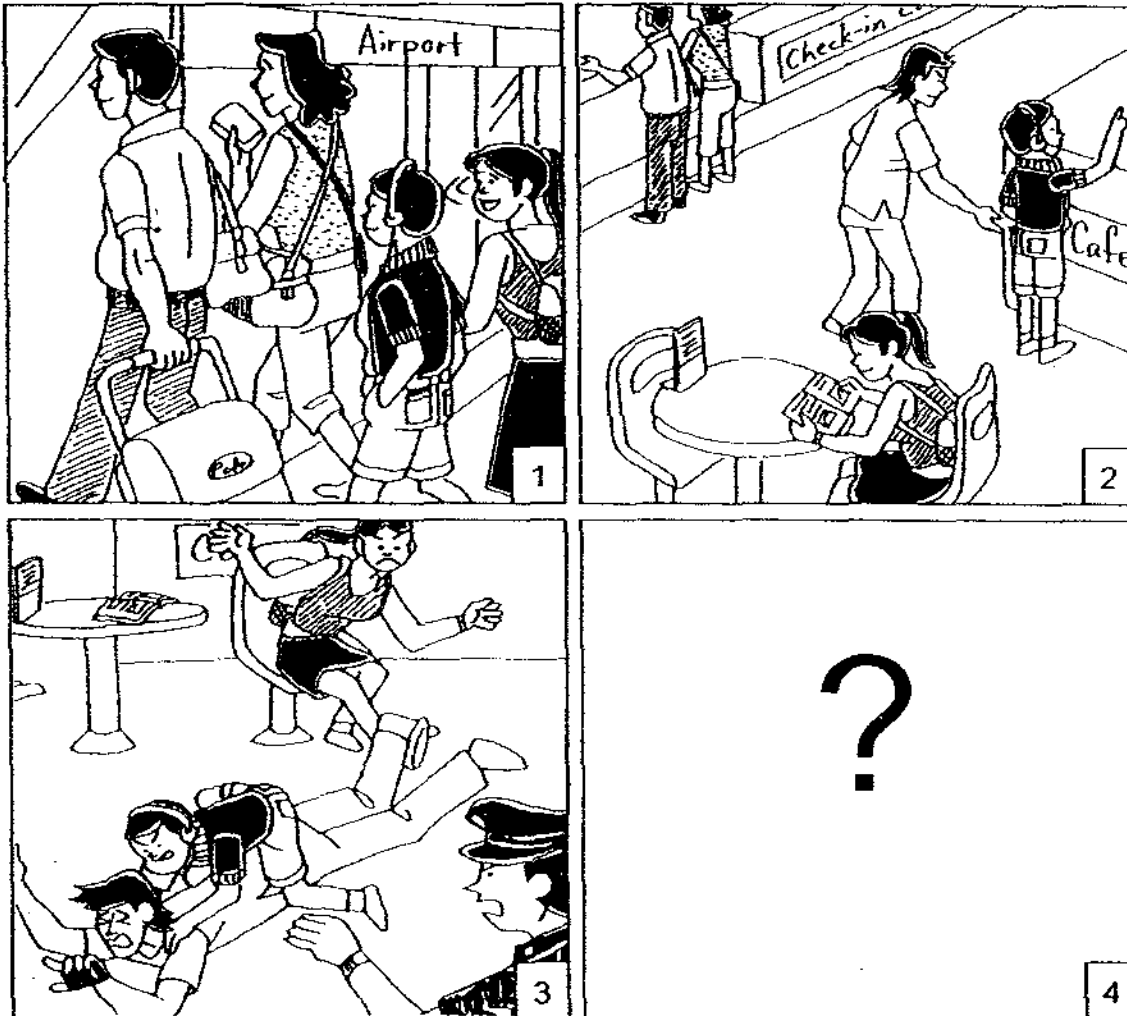

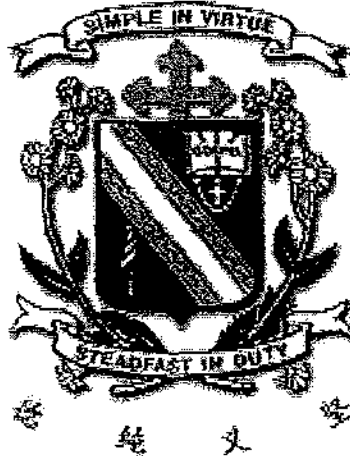

A rainforest is a dense, warm jungle where the rain falls nearly every day. It is alive with more than three thousand kinds of trees and plants. Some of these trees are as tall as 20-storeyed buildings and tower over the entire forest. It is also home to a ridiculous number of species of animals that depend on these trees for shelter and food.

Rainforests can be found in Africa, America, Asia, Australia and India. The largest of these grows along the Amazon River in South America. It is called the Amazon Rainforest and "the lungs of our planet". The trees and other plants of this rainforest breathe in the vast quantities of carbon dioxide that we pump into the environment, and breathe out more than twenty percent of the Earth's oxygen.

Different plants and animals live in different parts of a rainforest. The top of a rainforest looks like a giant carpet of leaves. This layer of leaves and branches is like the roof of the forest and is known as the canopy. Giant spiders, eagles and spider monkeys live in this sunny part of the forest.

The middle layer, or the understorey, is a cool dark environment made up of smaller trees, ferns and vines. Here you will find armies of ants and termites, and the well-camouflaged sloth.

The bottom layer is called the forest floor. This level has very few plants but teems with animal life from microscopic insects and worms to the largest forest mammals and reptiles. Here, tree roots snake across the forest floor which is covered by a layer of wet rotting leaves known as leaf litter.

As more people become aware that our world depends on the rainforest for life, they try to stop others from cutting down so many trees. We can play our part by using less paper. Together, we can save our rainforests and our planet.
