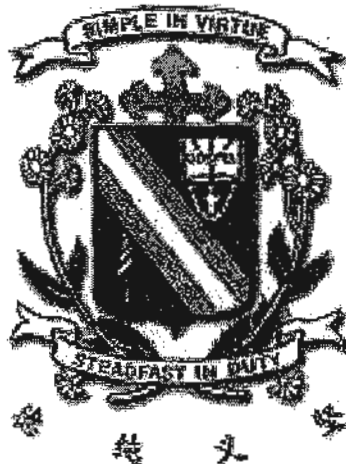





There are many amazing stories of people who survived volcanic eruptions. The most famous volcanic survivor of all time was a man called August Cyparis. He survived the eruption of Mount Pelee, a volcano, which is located near the town of St. Pierre on the French Caribbean Island of Martinique. In April 1902, the town of St. Pierre started experiencing earth tremors. On 8 May 1902, Mount Pelee erupted **catastrophically**, killing about 30,000 people. August Cyparis was reportedly the sole survivor from St. Pierre.

25-year-old August Cyparis was nicknamed "Samson" as he was strong and muscular. He worked as a common labourer. He frequently got himself into trouble with the authorities. The evening before the eruption, he had been arrested for disorderly behaviour and was locked up in an old jail cell in the town of St Pierre.

On 8 May, Cyparis was alone in his cell with only a small opening in the wall above the door. While waiting for his breakfast, his cell became dark and he was overcome by intense gusts of hot air mixed with ash that had entered through the opening. He held his breath while experiencing intense pain. Soon, the heat faded away. In that short moment, his hands, arms, legs and back were deeply burned by the hot gases that had seeped into his cell. Luckily, his clothes did not catch fire. He managed to stay alive for four days before he was rescued by other survivors from neighbouring towns.

Cyparis survived because the cell had very thick stone walls and the door opened away from the volcano. In fact, his cell was bomb-proof and was the most fortified building in the city. This saved his life. Cyparis was later employed by the famous Barnum's circus in America as the man who lived through **Doomsday**. He became a minor celebrity, touring America and telling his tale of how he survived the eruption of Mount Pelee.
